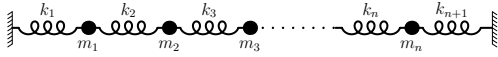


Fig. 1 Title 1

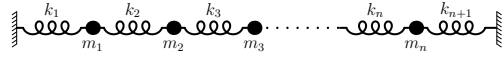
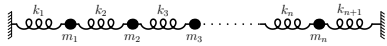
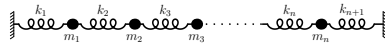


Fig. 2 Title 2

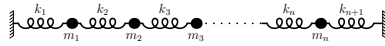


Fig. 4 Title 6

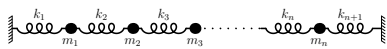


Fig. 5 Title 7
